CASA MORRA is the new space designed by Giuseppe Morra at Palazzo Cassano Ayerbo D'Aragona in Naples.

This is the next step in the Neapolitan patron of the arts' great adventure as he transfers his immense collection, accumulated in over forty years of activity on the international arts scene, to this new location.

Casa Morra will not be a static exhibition space but will become an archive of contemporary art, a place of dynamism encouraging reflection and research on society and its development.

A 'house of ideas' where the past blends into the present and the future, defying time with a programme mapped out until 2116.

Beppe Morra has in fact planned exhibitions for the next 100 years, using a 'snakes and ladders' system of references, cross-overs and turnings back. The exhibition cycles are governed by the alchemy of the numbers 3 and 7 to coincide with the number of artists on show or the number of works and exhibition sequences.

Giuseppe Morra will move into his new house, a monastery in the Materdei district, with over two thousand works of art accumulated over time, making it the New Medina of contemporary art in Naples. The house will be a workshop planning the next hundred years of events, entwining past and future, renewing and multiplying concepts and becoming a labyrinth of study and encounter. News of the event is not only a testimony to the theme of the vitality of those involved,

but offers a vision of a new private institution rich in value - a change of scale for the Fondazione Morra and the Naples Art District.

The snakes and ladders game is not a reference to the labyrinth in Crete, but to the exuberant Chartres maze.

Alpha and Omega are one and the same, and the need to go back to the beginning becomes increasingly pressing. The Manifesto is not an image of disorder, but of the complexity of the issues revealed by the simplicity of the path that always leads to Casa Morra. With each round trip, the Casa grows on the cognitive level, becoming the largest in the current city, bringing to it the chance to recognize that is an open, inclusive and international contemporary reality.

THE GIANTS OF THEATRE ART **JULIAN BECK - HERMANN NITSCH -**SHOZO SHIMAMOTO + JOSEPH BEUYS

I Giganti dell'Arte dal Teatro initiates a dialogue between four personalities for whom art became a way of life: Julian Beck, a painter from 1944 to 1954, who transitioned from abstract expressionism to anarchic and street theatre, to life theatre and founded the Living Theatre with Judith Malina; Hermann Nitsch, the founding father of Viennese Actionism, whose Orgien Mysterien Theater comes close to the idea of 'total work of art' in a form of synaesthetic theatre that penetrates the depths of the unconscious to spark off a cathartic reaction. Then there is Shozo Shimamoto, founding member of the Gutai group, who uses colour both materially and spatially to create an action-painting that no longer relies on the brush itself but on the movements of the artist as he works. The fourth is Joseph Beuys, a pivotal figure of the neo avant-garde movement, who believed in the fusion of art and life, artistic experiment, and political commitment, leading to the idea of 'social sculpture', based on the principle that 'every man is an artist'. Casa Morra shows that art is intuitive knowledge that brings change, resistance, and

revolution to the lives of those who embrace it through creative experience. The Casa is open to the public once again, this time with the accent on experience, to which Hermann Nitsch will defer, performing a *Lehraktion*: a theoretical action on the basic tenets of his sensorial and ecstatic theatre. Casa Morra is not only a place where works of art are exhibited and conserved; it is a dynamic

space where research is an essential part of the overall project, a 'home of ideas' for archive departments and workshops that start from the past to look at future possibilities The Living Theatre Archive contains texts, documents, notes and correspondence, as well

as Judith Malina's private papers, photographs and slides, posters, invitations, journals, books, magazines, and video recordings, all dating from the years 1969 to 2015. It also holds a large section of costumes and props. The archive has grown over time, thanks to the friendship between Giuseppe Morra, Judith Malina, and Hanon Reznikov. Casa Morra is also home to the Mario Franco Archives, a book and media library containing a collection of books, catalogues, film, DVDs, and video material in various analog and digital formats produced and collected in over 50 years of activity, representing a number of different aspects of film from the earliest exponents of the 1920s avant-garde to the experiments of the American underground and present day digital productions. The opening also sees the inauguration at Casa Morra of Gian Maria Tosatti's 3_Lucifero

archeologia (albero), one of the 'Sette Stagioni dello Spirito', a site-specific project that the artist has developed in Naples, setting up seven environmental installations during his three years of residency at the Morra Foundation.


